Beginner Knit Cable Hat: This class is the perfect step after your first project. Learn to knit in the round and work cables in this darling hat. Made with bulky yarn, quick project is fantastic for handmade holiday gift giving!

Beginner Knit Socks: Learn to knit the coziest thing in the history of the world – hand knit socks! In this class students will learn all the techniques needed to knit top down socks, including how to knit in the round on double pointed needles, how to work a heel flap, how to work a short row heel, how to pick up stitches and how to work Kitchener (grafting) stitch. You will be making a baby sock in class and doing an adult sock on your own during this class.

Beginner Preventing & Fixing Mistakes: Ever get to the end of a row and find you are short a stitch or two, or that you have too many stitches, or that holes have inexplicably appeared in your knitting? Maybe your stitches are looking a little wonky and you just don't know how to fix them. Then this class is perfect for the beginner knitter. Learn what common mistakes we all make while knitting and, more importantly, how to fix them.

Beginner Crochet Hat: Are you a crochet beginner who is ready to take the next step and make your first hat? This is the perfect project class for you! This hat is worked flat, seamed up the side and gathered at the top in order to create the traditional stocking hat shape. Plus, this pattern is easily adjustable for any head size or yarn weight, and also looks great in variegated yarns. It's never too soon to start hooking for the holidays, and these hats make great gifts!

Beginning Knitting: Learn the basics with this two-part class! Students will learn how to cast on, the knit & purl stitch, how to work knit and purl stitches in the same row, and how to read a pattern. We will work toward knitting your first project, the Wheat Scarf by Tin Can Knits!

Crochet Slip Stitch Hat- So you're ready to move beyond the basics and learn to combine stitches to make a project to WOW your friends and family? This class focuses on learning how to mix crocheted slip stitches and other standard stitches to add shape and texture to a project. We'll use the Indigo Hat and Cowl pattern to make the hat, and practice combining slip stitches and half-double crochets to create the beautiful texture and shape in this hat pattern. AND: the largest size in the pattern calls for only 105 yards of bulky/super-bulky weight yarn!

Crochet Spring Ripple Scarf- It's cold! It's dark! If you're already dreaming of spring, let's make a scarf to swaddle us but bring the spirit of spring while we wait for the warm-up. The Spring Ripple Scarf uses the traditional chevron and filet crochet techniques to create a scarf that has a solid architecture foundation and a delicate laciness that transitions well to spring. In this class, you'll learn the chevron and filet techniques as you create the scarf.

Crochet Woodpile Mittens: Have you taken our Beginner Hat Class and want to try making a set of mittens to match? Or would you just like to learn how to make mittens for any size of hands using any gauge of yarn? Then join us for the Woodpile Mittens class! This class takes your skills beyond the basic hat to further learn shaping, seaming, working in the round, and finishing, and you'll have a pattern that will allow you to make mittens for the tiniest frost sprites up to big hairy yetis.

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Henry's Bunny- Learn short rows while making this cute little bunny. If you ever wanted to knit a softie but was afraid it would be too fiddly, this is the perfect quickie project to start with. There is even a bigger rabbit size pattern to follow-up with after.

Holden Shawl- This is Lace Shawl Knitting:101! If you have never knit a triangular shawl, or even lace for that matter, this class is for you. While we are working this lovely shawl pattern, you will learn things like a tab start, basic chart reading, a stretchy bind-off and how to block your lovely once you have finished.

Intro to Crochet: Ready to proudly tell your friends that you're a hooker? Whether you've been a knitter for years or have never picked up needles or a hook, in this two-part class you will learn the slip knot cast on, chain stitch, and single crochet; different hook styles and which will work best for you; the slip stitch, half-double crochet, and double crochet; and how to read a crochet pattern by getting to know stitch abbreviations and following a pattern to make a dishcloth/trivet or a scarf.

Intro to Spinning: Come learn to spin. Take the first steps in learning to make your own yarn. We will practice on spindles and learn how a spinning wheel works. This is a spindle AND wheel class that will teach you the basics of spinning and fiber, what fiber to buy and what the fiber preparation terms mean. Learn to spin and play with fiber!

***Open Sweater Study:** Knit the sweater of your choice in Open Sweater Study! Pick any sweater, any construction, any size, as simple or complex as you like. This class is designed to be flexible to suit the student's needs with help on certain skills (like fitting and bust darts) and more. This class is for the student to get support and instruction on whatever area they need help with at that moment. Sign up for as many or as few classes as you need.

Rigid Heddle Weaving II: Come take the next small step into Rigid Heddle Weaving and warp for a scarf to weave at home. Learn two-color warping and warp your loom for a houndstooth scarf. Yarn is available for purchase in the studio; this project will take two skeins. Learn how to calculate, without pain, your warp and weft; what heddle works and why; and warp and start weaving all in an afternoon. You will finish your scarf at home so this class requires you to have your own loom or you are welcome to purchase a 15" cricket, with a class discount, from me and go home with a new loom and a project already on it.

Sweet Eleanor Scarf: Let's make the Sweet Eleanor Scarf! This is the perfect project to follow up work in an Intro to Crochet class, or if you want to update your accessories closet with a delicate and whimsical piece.

Toe-up 2-at-a-Time Socks: Want *two* socks that fit just right? Knitting two socks at a time helps you beat that second sock syndrome, and makes sure that your socks match. You can try them on as you go by knitting toe up, and make the leg as long as you want so that you don't waste any of that precious sock yarn. You can use either magic loop or two circular method, both will be taught in class.

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Uppsala Slippers: This class will stretch your colorwork skills a bit further while making these sweet snowflake slippers. You will learn colorwork in small rounds using double pointed needles. This is not for first time colorworkers but is great for the second time and above!

Class pricing and policies

Classes are \$10 per hour plus supplies unless specified; length of class is dependent upon the complexity of the subject. All classes are two hours and up. You can purchase classes individually or apply package credit. The price and length each class will be clearly defined in the class description.

Packages of class hours are available at \$100 per 10 hours, which includes 10 hours of instruction plus one 10% off coupon for supplies and one voucher for a one-hour Knit/Crochet/Spin Doctor session.

Classes have a minimum of 3 students and maximum of 6 to 12 students, depending on the complexity of the subject.

The Knit/Crochet Doctor sessions are \$15 per half hour and are available several times during the month; times are on the calendar. Get the help you need with a tricky stitch sequence, an unclear pattern, a runaway dropped stitch, or any other knitting, crocheting or spinning challenge. Call to schedule a session.

Private tutoring sessions are \$25 per hour.
